The 2025 edition, titled “[Navigating Fractures and Uncertainty](#)”, offers a comprehensive analysis of pressing global challenges. It examines the future of the global order amid shifting power dynamics; the reconfiguration of the Eurasian geopolitical landscape; lessons from ongoing conflicts in the Middle East and their long-term implications; the future of Euro-Atlantic-Indo-Pacific cooperation and strategic alignments; digital capabilities as a strategic resource in contemporary security; and, the control and cooperation needed in the development of advanced technologies.
